# **VRCF**

The Vasumathi Ramaswami Centenary Foundation (VRCF) was established in the loving memory of Vasumathi Ramaswami. VRCF was established with the objective of contributing towards creating a world where education, healthcare, and cultural enrichment are accessible to all, empowering individuals and communities to thrive. As one of the projects, VRCF has initiated Launchpad, to empower and enable talented and driven youngsters to achieve their aspirations and sculpt them into future leaders.



#### LAUNCHPAD

We have kickstarted the 1st cohort of Launchpad with 15 talented candidates from 10 districts. Launchpad is a unique program designed to nurture motivated students, equipping them with skills and mentorship to become future leaders. The program takes a personalized approach, fostering frequent, in-depth mentor-mentee interactions.

With an intensive mentoring model, Launchpad aims to ignite curiosity, creative thinking, and innovation among mentees, providing them with the tools and confidence to aspire for greatness. This transformative journey shapes them into leaders who can inspire and drive positive change in the world.

This annual newsletter highlights the diverse activities undertaken during the year 2024, which included a range of sessions, personalized mentoring, and engaging assignments. From language and grammar lessons to skill-building workshops, 2024 offered numerous opportunities for students to enhance their conceptual understanding, practical skills, and personal growth. These activities a well-rounded contributed to and enriching experience, fostering dynamic a learning environment for all.



#### LAUNCHPAD CONCEPTION

Although the concept for the Launchpad initiative was conceived years ago, it truly began to take shape in early 2024. The groundwork for this transformative program started in February 2024, when we began the search for candidates who could benefit from the mentorship and resources it would offer.

The selection process was thorough, beginning with the announcement of the program, followed by an initial screening based on academic achievements and aspirations. This was followed by online interviews and home visits. Out of 300 applications, we shortlisted 15 candidates and officially onboarded them. Batch 1 was selected from this pool of applicants, with 15 students chosen from 10 different districts.

Despite coming from backgrounds marked by adversity, these young individuals stood out due to their exceptional academic accomplishments. The Launchpad program officially kicked off in July 2024, with this first cohort serving as a pilot project. The selected candidates are receiving scholarship as well as mentorship from VRCF.







Most of the candidates hail from single-parent households, tribal communities, families of daily wage workers, and homes with unsupportive alcoholic fathers, Yet these students have managed to defy the odds. They have excelled academically, scoring above 85%—with the highest achieving student scoring an impressive 95.5%.

Despite facing such overwhelming challenges, these students have demonstrated resilience and determination, using their circumstances as motivation to succeed. What sets them apart is their ability to achieve remarkable academic results with minimal resources and no external support. Their perseverance and drive are proof that with the right opportunities, they can reach even greater heights.


Note: We have disqualified two candidates due to their lack of response to multiple calls, follow-ups, and participation in activities.



#### VIRTUAL MEETINGS

We began holding virtual meetings with the students to build rapport and establish a strong connection. The sessions covered key topics such as opportunities, communication, problem-solving, and identifying problems in our surroundings. As part of the program, students were assigned a project development task, which they would present during the introductory meeting. The students participated with great enthusiasm and pitched their ideas confidently.

Students participated in an activity where they identified and researched a problem in their surroundings and proposed a creative solution. They presented their problem statements and solutions on topics such as open defecation, women's safety, menstrual hygiene, sewage over spilling, student mentoring, and solar lighting







One standout candidate proposed a project focused on improving sewage systems, driven by her personal experience of how her family suffers during floods. This idea not only highlighted her awareness of local challenges but also showcased her desire to make a meaningful impact. In a remarkable turn of events, this candidate has now been granted a patta for a house from the government, marking a real success of the program. This achievement reflects the power of mentorship, initiative, and the potential for Leadership that these students carry with them.

#### LAUNCHPAD'S INTRODUCTORY MEET

The introductory meeting aimed to build rapport with students and parents, set clear expectations for the mentorship program, and create a welcoming environment. It focused on understanding each student's background and needs, allowing for personalized guidance. The meeting introduced available resources, emphasized open communication, and aligned the mentorship program with students' academic and personal aspirations, fostering motivation and engagement.







The event, held over two days at Intellect Design, Chennai, included a mix of interactive sessions, activities, and inspiring talks. It began with a prayer and the lighting of the lamp, followed by an introductory address by Mr.Seshasayee. Mr.Arun Jain shared his journey of overcoming challenges and pursuing dreams, inspiring students to adopt a mindset of resilience and lifelong learning. The students also had a Design Thinking Walk through, where they were introduced to the human-centric problem-solving approach.

The program featured motivational talks by Mr. Saravanan Balakrishnan, who shared the story of his e-bike startup, and Ms. Malathy, who taught students to set goals using the SMART framework. Students presented their problem statements and solutions on topics such as open defecation, women's safety, menstrual hygiene, sewage overspilling, student mentoring, and solar lighting. A fun clay modeling activity for Vinayagar Chaturthi added a creative touch to the program.

#### VRCF WEBSITE LAUNCH

In the Introductory meet, The VRCF Website www.vrcffoundation.org was launched by Mr.R.Seshasayee and Mr. Arun Jain, followed by a brief presentation by VRCF coordinator Mrs. Shenbakam. She explained Vasumathi Ramaswami Charitable Foundation (VRCF) focuses on providing educational support, medical assistance, financial aid for the underprivileged, and promoting cultural activities. The foundation's goal is to create a future where education, healthcare, and cultural enrichment empower individuals and communities to thrive, and she introduced its new flagship initiative, Launchpad, aimed at nurturing future leaders.





#### HISTORY WALK


A history walk at Mahabalipuram where the students could learn history, architecture, and culture of this ancient coastal town in Tamil Nadu, India. Mahabalipuram is a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site with monuments and temples, which date back to the 7th and 8th centuries during the Pallava dynasty. A history enthusiast, and also an advocate by profession Mr. Balaji PremKumar is explained the students by helping them understand the Pallava dynasty, architectural styles, mythology and trade and cultural exchanges. 


#### SPOKEN ENGLISH COURSE

A need was identified to address the communication and confidence gap among students, particularly in English. As a part of communication training, Spoken English training program was arranged. The tutor conducted a preassessment. Classroom interactions revealed that some students need practice in speaking and vocabulary to boost their confidence and communication skills. The course was organized to teach functional grammar, pronunciation, and vocabulary building, starting at a pre-intermediate level. The classes are activity-based, and assignments are given to reinforce learning. A final assessment will be conducted at the end of the course to measure progress. Based on this input, we have arranged two activity-based classes per week for a duration of 3 months (Sep - Dec 2024). So far, 29 classes have been held, providing students with ample opportunities to develop their skills and practice their learning.









In the sessions, the major focus was on building vocabulary and improving grammar. Each session included conversation activities that allowed students to practice and apply what they were learning. These activities helped them develop their speaking skills and gain confidence in using English in real-life situations. Some of the topics covered in these sessions included introducing themselves and others, sharing basic personal information, talking about their family members, and describing their homes and daily routines. Additionally, students practiced describing people and their towns, discussing hobbies, giving short movie reviews, engaging in shopping-related dialogues, and talking about health and illness. These interactive activities were designed to help students build practical communication skills while expanding their vocabulary and understanding of grammar.

#### PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

Pathways to Success is a leadership program that takes place every Saturday, with students assigned weekly assignments. This is a 150-week program, meticulously designed to comprehensively cover all the competencies required for future leaders. In its first year, the program is focusing on key areas such as In-Depth Learning, Problem Solving, Leadership, Critical Thinking, Self-Confidence, Self-Awareness. This program is designed with the goal of fostering the holistic development of each student, equipping them with the core competencies needed for success.







The program also includes need-based sessions on topics like Email Etiquette, Time Management, and Effective Learning Strategies. These practical lessons complement the core competencies of the program, ensuring that students gain the skills necessary for both academic and personal success. So far, 12 sessions have been completed.

Pathways to Success is designed to empower students with the tools they need to thrive, fostering not only academic excellence but also personal growth and leadership skills. Through consistent learning, self-reflection, and practical exercises, students are developing into well-rounded individuals ready to take on the challenges of the future.

#### **VOCABULARY BUILDING**


Every day, five words or idioms are shared with students, accompanied by their Tamil translations, to help them expand and enrich their vocabulary. Students are actively noting these down daily, integrating them into their everyday communication and language practice.



#### WRITE UP TASK

Students are encouraged to submit a write-up every day. On some days, prompts are provided to guide them, while on others, they are free to choose their own topics. They are encouraged to write in English, even if it contains grammatical errors, to build confidence and improve their skills. Students are participating enthusiastically in this activity.


#### **KNOWLEDGE EXPRESS**

Knowledge Express is a seminar marathon conducted by students where students delivered a concise, seven-minute presentations on their field of interest, followed by a three-minute Q&A segment that sparks active discussion.

The primary goal of this program is to develop students' communication abilities, build their confidence, and enhance their knowledge through regular public speaking opportunities. Each session had a voting process to recognize the Best Speaker and the Best Question. Students shared their knowledge with their peers and thoroughy enjoyed the activity.

#### PHYSICS TUITION

Recognizing the need for additional support in physics to enhance conceptual understanding, an exclusive physics tuition was arranged for two NEET coaching students. Two dedicated classes were conducted, focusing on building a strong foundation in key physics concepts. The students found these sessions highly beneficial in clarifying their doubts and strengthening their understanding of the subject.




#### **ACCOUNTANCY MENTORING**







#### **PROGRESS**

The students have shown significant improvement in using vocabulary. While there are occasional errors, considering the two months of progress, they are performing well. Students can now confidently introduce themselves and have started improving their grammar. An assessment will be conducted at the end of December to evaluate progress.

Students are very quiet in Pathway sessions but are gradually warming up. They eagerly complete take-home assignments but are yet to express.

Students have shown significant improvement from where they started. They are opening up during one-to-one interactions, asking more questions, and expressing themselves freely, marking a major achievement in rapport building. Happy with the progress, but there is still a long way to go.

#### ONE TO ONE MENTORING

One-to-one mentoring sessions were conducted over calls, providing personalized guidance to students. During these sessions, students' progress was continuously monitored, and they were encouraged to share feedback and concerns regarding the program. Several students expressed the need for academic support in specific subjects, which was promptly addressed, while others demonstrated significant progress and were well ahead in their planning. This mentoring approach ensured that each student's unique needs were met, fostering a supportive learning environment. The coordinator conducts home visits to check on the students' progress and follow up on concerns and feedback. For NEET candidates, along with the parents, the coordinator also attended parent-teacher meetings to gain firsthand insight into the students' progress.
